#### CSM130/21/22 - PUBLIC FORUM

There was one member of the public present.

#### CSM131/21/22 - TO RECEIVE APOLOGIES OF ABSENCE

Apologies had been received from Cllr Palmer and District Cllr Norris.

#### CSM132/21/22 - TO RECEIVE DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

None had been received.

#### CSM133/21/22 - TO RECEIVE APPLICATIONS FOR DISPENSATION

## CSM134/21/22 - TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON 30<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2021

**It was AGREED:** That the minutes of the meeting held on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2021 be approved as a true record and signed by the Chair.

#### CSM135/21/22 - TO RECEIVE THE COUNTY COUNCILLOR'S REPORT - CLLR M HICKS

Cllr Hicks' full report was circulated prior to the meeting and would be published on the parish website.

He briefly went through his report stating the following:

- The Budget would be approved in February with the main areas of expenditure and provision going to Children's Services and Adult Care. To achieve the budget the Council Tax would be increased to 1.99% and Social Care 1%.
- Drainage to ensure all poor drainage be improved thus ensuring water would not appear at the side of roads which in turn could cause roads to break up. £10 million was being put into the project.
- Road Signs £1 million was being put towards road signs. In the past road signs had been a low
  priority with many fading, breaking and collapsing. A project had now been approved to ensure all
  road signs in the County that needed attention would receive it.

- Special Education Needs and Disabilities (SEND) £1 million pounds was being put into SEND to ensure the county's provision was appropriate.
- Street Lights 10,000 street lights had currently be replaced with LED lighting. It was part of becoming carbon neutral by 2030 and in time would save money.

Cllr Haynes informed Cllr Hicks that the Parish Clerk had reported the missing 'Creeting St Mary; directional sign on the A140 opposite the entrance to Creeting Bottoms. It was a sign that was very useful for people turning into Creeting Bottoms especially during the darker evenings. With the A140 being a very busy and dangerous road and the fact that accidents had taken place at the junction in question, it had been a surprise that Highways had stated the replacement of the sign was "not a priority".

Cllr Hicks asked that the Clerk forward him the email along with the reference number and he would enquire further.

# CSM136/21/22 – TO RECEIVE THE DISTRICT COUNCILLOR'S REPORT – CLLRS NORRIS & CLLR PHILLIPS

Cllr Norris was not present at the meeting. His report had been circulated prior to the meeting and would be published on the parish's website.

The Clerk also informed members that two people had resigned from volunteering on the Community Speedwatch Team which would leave six volunteers, which was the minimum required.

The Clerk reported on the Council's current financial position and movements since the last meeting. It was reported that the balance in the accounts on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2022 was £25,555.27.

# **CSM138/21/22 - PLANNING APPLICATIONS**

**Ref: DC/21/06947** - Application under Section 73 of The Town and Country Planning Act for DC/21/03030 for Variation of Condition 2 (Approved plans and documents) to introduce a single storey rear extension - Land Near Highfield, All Saints Road, Creeting St Mary

Members were confused as to what the access road that continues through the plot will be used for and asked that the Clerk enquire about it. **Clerk to action.**

Cllr Haynes reminded members that the Parish Council had been approached by the Street Naming Department at the District Council in relation to the naming of the new development proposed for land adjacent Red House Farm, All Saints Road.

The developers had suggested The Meare and Mid Suffolk were asking for either confirmation that that name would be acceptable or if the Parish Council felt they had another suggestion.

Following a brief discussion members felt that either Dunches Close or St Olave's Close would be more appropriate due to the site being near to Dunches Lane and also the historic St Olave's Church site a little further away.

**It was AGREED:** That the Clerk liaise with the Street Naming Department and make the suggestions as above.

#### CSM140/21/22 - LILLEY'S WOOD UPDATE

Members ha a brief discussion on the amount of signs needed for the Lilley's Wood site, the wording and anything else to be included.

#### CSM141/21/22 - REPAIR OF PLAY EQUIPMENT PARTS

Cllr Palmer had emailed members prior to the meeting in relation to repairs that were needed to parts of the play equipment which had included a handle that had rusted and needed replacement or repair and the traversing hold for the climbing frame.

Members were happy that these items be repaired and/or replaced by a volunteer in the village.

#### CSM142/21/22 - REPORTS

**Blacksmiths Field** – Cllr Palmer was not present at the meeting but had circulated her report prior to the meeting.

**SALC** – Cllr Coton reported that there had not been any recent meetings of SALC and the Area Forum was due to take place in March.

**Footpaths** – Cllr Scully reported that FP 54 – Creeting Hills to Sally Woods Lane – the railings had collapsed which he had reported to Highways Rights of Way for a second time. Also, at the beginning of that footpath there was also a broken fingerpost.

An issue with the footpath past the Highway Man had also been reported.

**Village Hall** – Cllr Haynes reported that the next meeting of the Village Hall Management Committee was due to be held the following week. She added that bookings were on the increase.

**Sustainability** – Cllr Craggs reported that he felt the hedges along parts of Flordon Road and All Saints Road could be cut back which would result in cars not being scratched when passing each other. If the hedges were cut back two feet it would help make the road at those points wider, which would be a lot better for motorists.

**It was AGREED:** That Cllr Craggs and Cllr Haynes speak with the hedgerow land owners in relation to this suggestion.

It was confirmed that Cllr Craggs was the Tree Warden for the village.

# CSM143/21/22 - MATTERS TO BE BROUGHT TO THE ATTENTION OF THE COUNCIL
