Babergh and Mid Suffolk District Councils condemn the Russian invasion of Ukraine and pledge support for refugees. Councillors from across the political divide stood united across both Mid Suffolk and Babergh this month, voting unanimously in favour of motions condemning the war in Ukraine.

## Councils mark progress against climate change and biodiversity ambitions.

## 200 new trees planted thanks to Forestry Commission funding.

More than 200 new trees were planted by Mid Suffolk and Babergh District Councils last month, thanks to a previously successful Suffolk bid to the Forestry Commission's Local Authority Treescapes Fund.

**Residents, tenants and landlords urged to lower energy bills.** Residents, tenants and landlords across Mid Suffolk and Babergh are being offered help to reduce the environmental impact of their homes, improve energy efficiency, and lower their energy use with a range of council support. **Community improvements funded by local development.** Community Infrastructure Levy bids of more than £175,000 to help improve local facilities and play areas across Mid Suffolk received the go-ahead this month.

**New cases of bird flu (Avian Influenza) found in Mid Suffolk.** Unfortunately further cases of Avian Influenza (bird flu) were confirmed in the district this month, affecting more than 50,000 birds since the start of the year. This month saw an outbreak at a property near Stowmarket, as well as at properties near Redgrave and Market Weston.
